Beschreibung: The Court of Monza includes the headquarters and the local branch of Desio and serves 62 municipalities located north of Milan. Both headquarters and branch deal with civil and criminal proceedings. Since the resident population counts 1.111.428 people, the Court of Monza ranks sixth among all Italian Courts. Moreover, its territory is characterized by a high density of firms.

Projektbeschreibung kurz

Italian justice system is the most expensive in Europe: 69 Euros are paid for "services" provided by our 165 Courts, 200 branch offices and almost the same number of Prosecutor's Offices. As far as civil justice is concerned, the ratio of pending cases to the annual number of the new ones is more than 100%, whereas it varies from 10 to 40% in other countries. The economic impact of this slowness is estimated in an amount around the 1% of the GDP. In 2009 the Minister of Public Authority, the Minister of Justice and the Regions agreed with the European Union on the need for an interregional project called "Dissemination of best practices in judicial offices" on the source of European Social Funds. 23 regional bids were prepared and assigned to 97 judicial offices participating in the project (that is 6% of judicial offices in Italy). The idea is that exemplary projects can disseminate solutions and methods throughout the entire system.
